Since March of 2020 and the onset of the COVID-19 pandemic, The Learning Community's overarching focus has been ensuring our students' and families' equitable access to distance learning tools and critical services. Our school anticipated these needs and concerns well before transitioning to distance learning temporarily, always keeping students' needs at the forefront of our response, while remaining cognizant of the socioeconomic challenges our families face.

Also, given the close, trusting relationships we have with our families, at the onset of the pandemic we took initiative to open a hotline to field any questions our families had in regards to their distance learning, technological support or seeking additional resources for food, housing, healthcare, immigration services, etc.

Although we took these crucial steps, our students still struggled throughout the pandemic with language development.

With your support we are investing in the resources needed to accelerate our students' learning and do all we can for our community.

#### **OUR WAY BACK**

Our strategically revamped English Language Arts (ELA) program will grow strong readers, writers and critical thinkers who have the skills to access conversations where decisions are made. As such, our students will learn to read and write in a rigorous classroom environment meeting grade-level standard expectations. Our ELA program will offer a balance of foundational skill development as well as the ability to take and express multiple points of view on a topic backed by factual evidence. Our classroom libraries will offer literature that both mirrors our students' lived experience as well as provide a window into the experiences of others. Our curriculum will grow students' knowledge about inequity across race, gender and wealth and offer our students the opportunity to apply their skills by thinking through and offering up solutions. Our ELA experience is central to growing student leaders.
