The Learning Community, an innovative urban public school in Rhode Island, offers The Education Fellows Program, a one-year opportunity for recent college graduates who seek professional experience in urban education and want to make a contribution to the lives of young learners.



Education Fellows will make a clear and targeted impact on cohorts of students and their dreams for the future.

The Education Fellows Program enables enthusiastic, creative and dedicated individuals who are exploring careers in public education to fulfill meaningful roles in a dynamic urban school alongside experienced professional teachers and administrators. Fellows serve as academic tutors and get to see firsthand strategies in the classroom, at recess and after school that will help close the achievement gap.



FINANCIAL AWARD: Education Fellows receive a living stipend of \$13,732, health insurance and a Segal AmeriCorps Education Award of \$5,920 after completing their term

TRAINING: Education Fellows receive intensive ongoing professional development from practicing experts in education. Fellows attend 3-6 weeks of training before teaching small groups and 2-3 hours of individualized training each week.

BEING A FELLOW

Education Fellows join a professional, welcoming and dedicated team of educators. Each Education Fellow will be assigned cohorts of students with whom they work in small groups or in one-on-one tutorials throughout the academic year. This critical, hands-on academic support is informed by classroom teachers and our Academic Specialist Team. Fellows also work with students in Central Falls, and Providence.



PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT

Education Fellows have serious responsibilities and roles in the lives of students, so they receive extensive, ongoing professional development.

Education Fellows are trained to support students throughout the school day in both academic and non-academic settings.

Fellows meet weekly as a team to reflect on their practice and participate in workshops related to their growth as a young professional. In addition, fellows have opportunities to learn about the management and growth of an innovative school and the many professional roles required to support students toward academic success.
