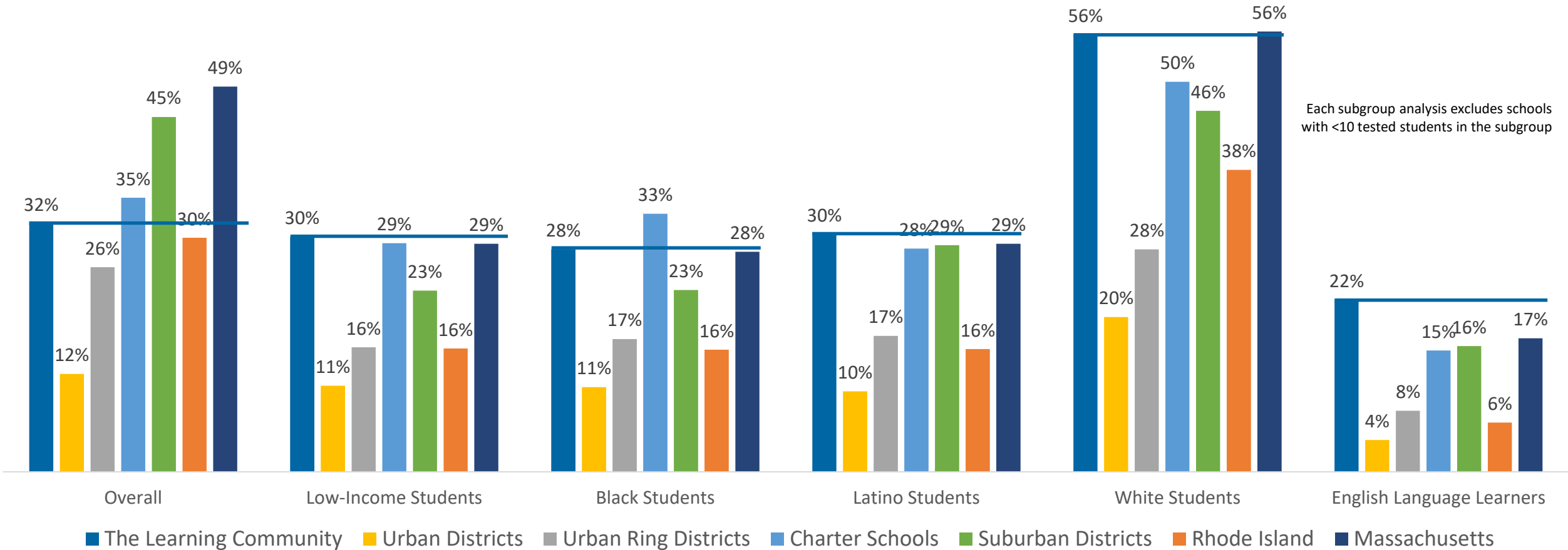

% Meeting or Exceeding Expectations

Grades 3–8

*The Learning Community's demographic subgroups reached expectations in math at a higher rate than their demographic peers in suburban, urban ring, and urban districts*

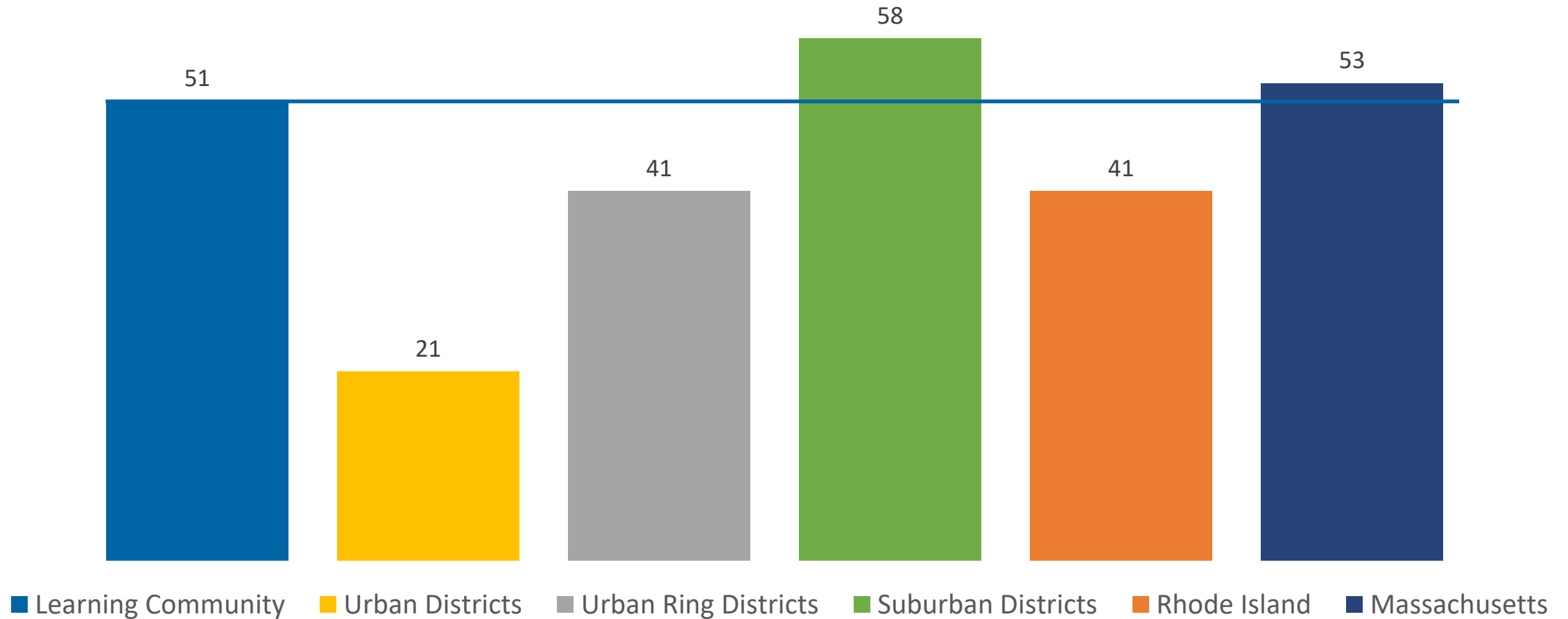


# RICAS 2019—ELA

Grades 3–5

% Meeting or Exceeding Expectations

*Learning Community elementary students reached expectations in ELA at a rate 25% higher than Rhode Island elementary students overall—approaching the rates of Massachusetts and of suburban Rhode Island schools*

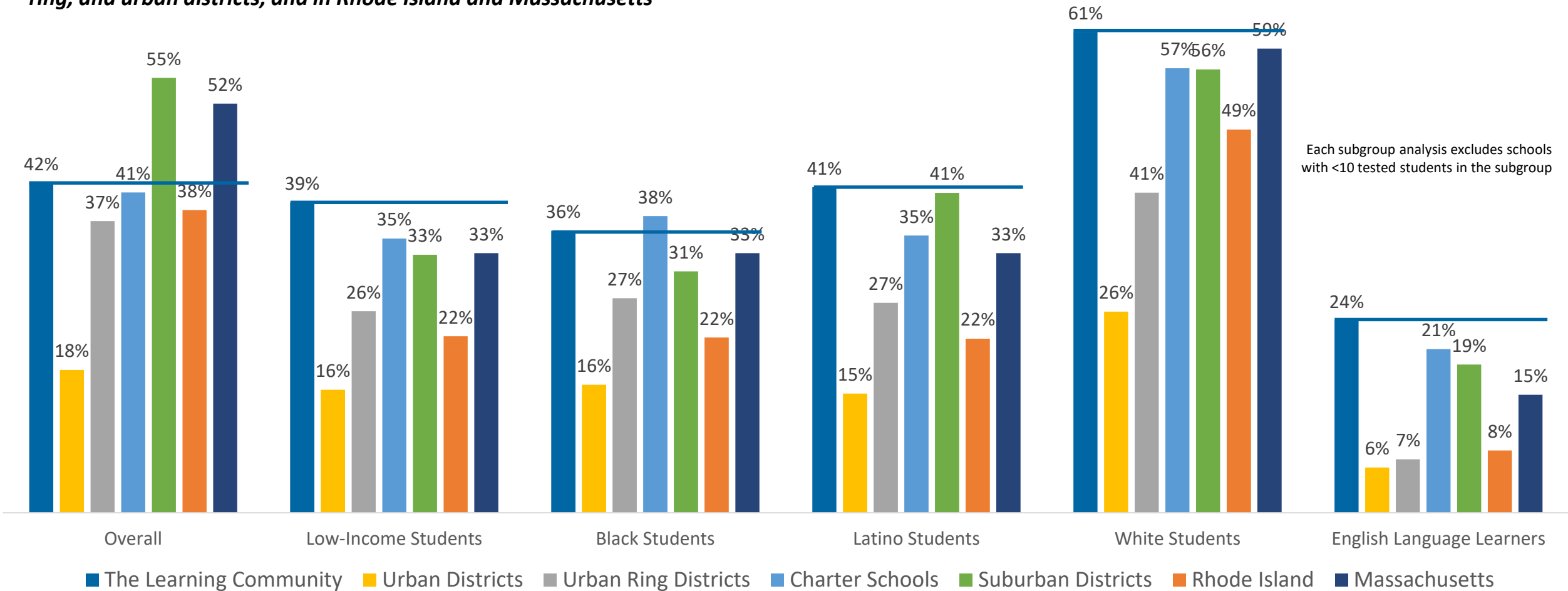


# RICAS 2019—ELA

Grades 3–8

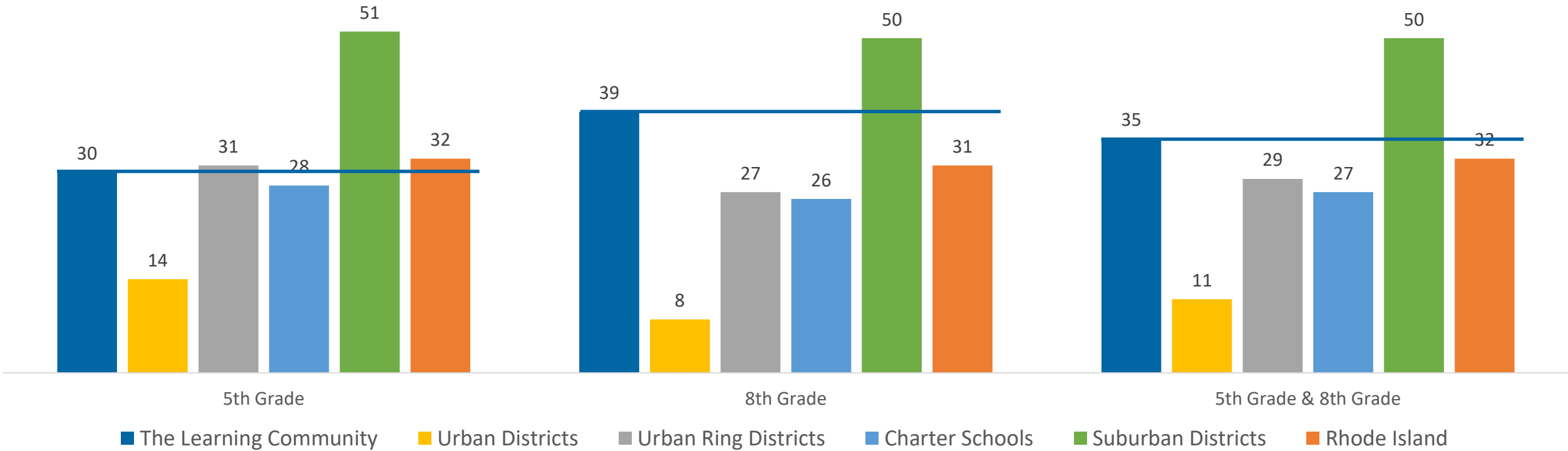

% Meeting or Exceeding Expectations

*Learning Community students reached expectations in science at a higher rate than their peers in urban and urban ring districts, charter schools, and Rhode Island overall*



# NGSA 2019—Science

Grades 5 & 8

% Meeting or Exceeding Expectations

*Learning Community low-income, black, and Latino students reached expectations in science at about the twice the rate of their demographic peers statewide*
