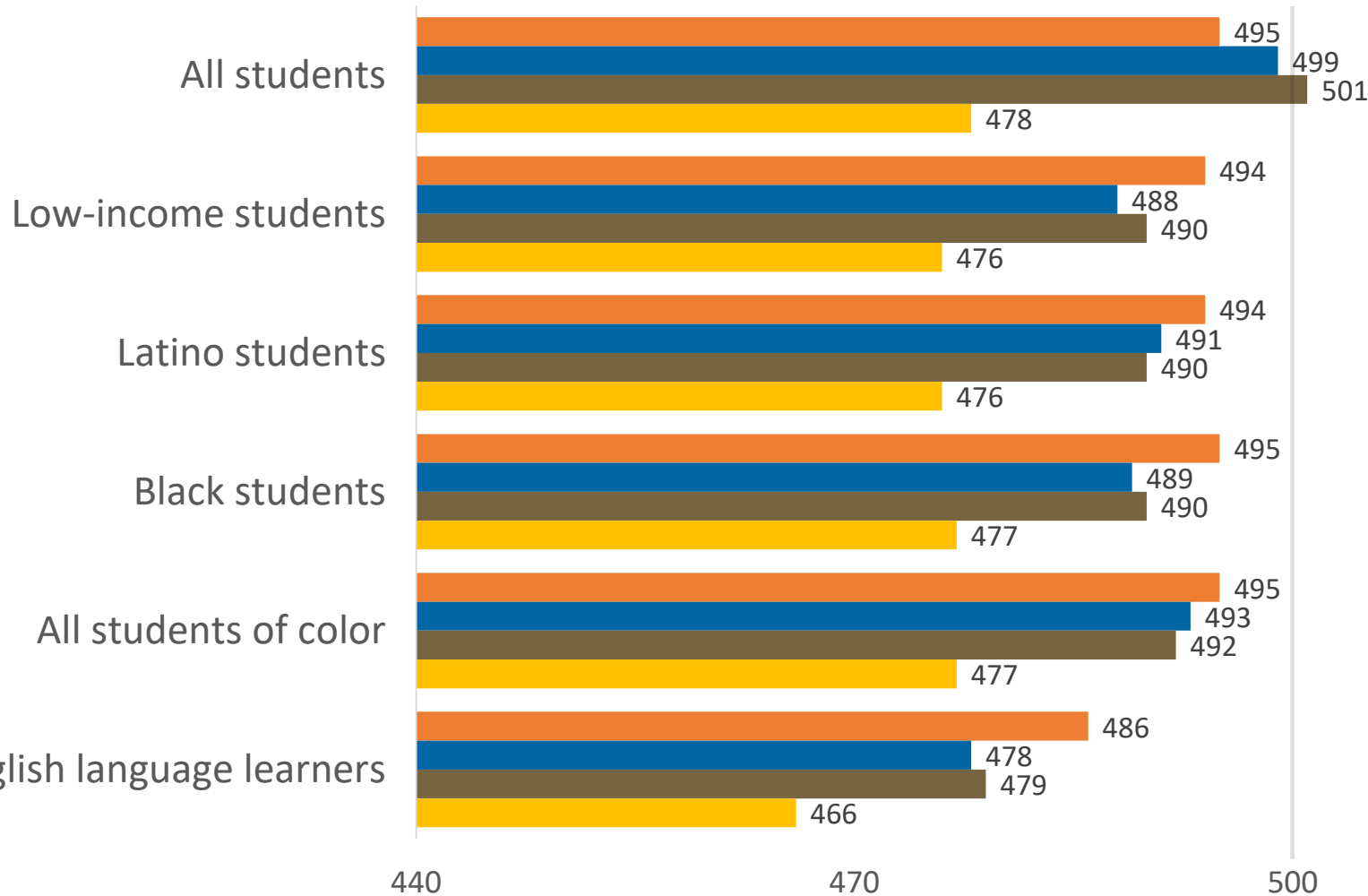


# RICAS 2018—ELA

## The Learning Community, Suburban Districts, Massachusetts, Urban Districts

### Average Scale Score



Each of The Learning Community’s demographic subgroups had a **higher average scale score—was closer to meeting expectations (500) as a cohort—than their demographic peers in *both* the Rhode Island suburbs *and* the state of Massachusetts.**

All students of color	13 of 44 districts	71
English language learners	3 of 28 districts	89

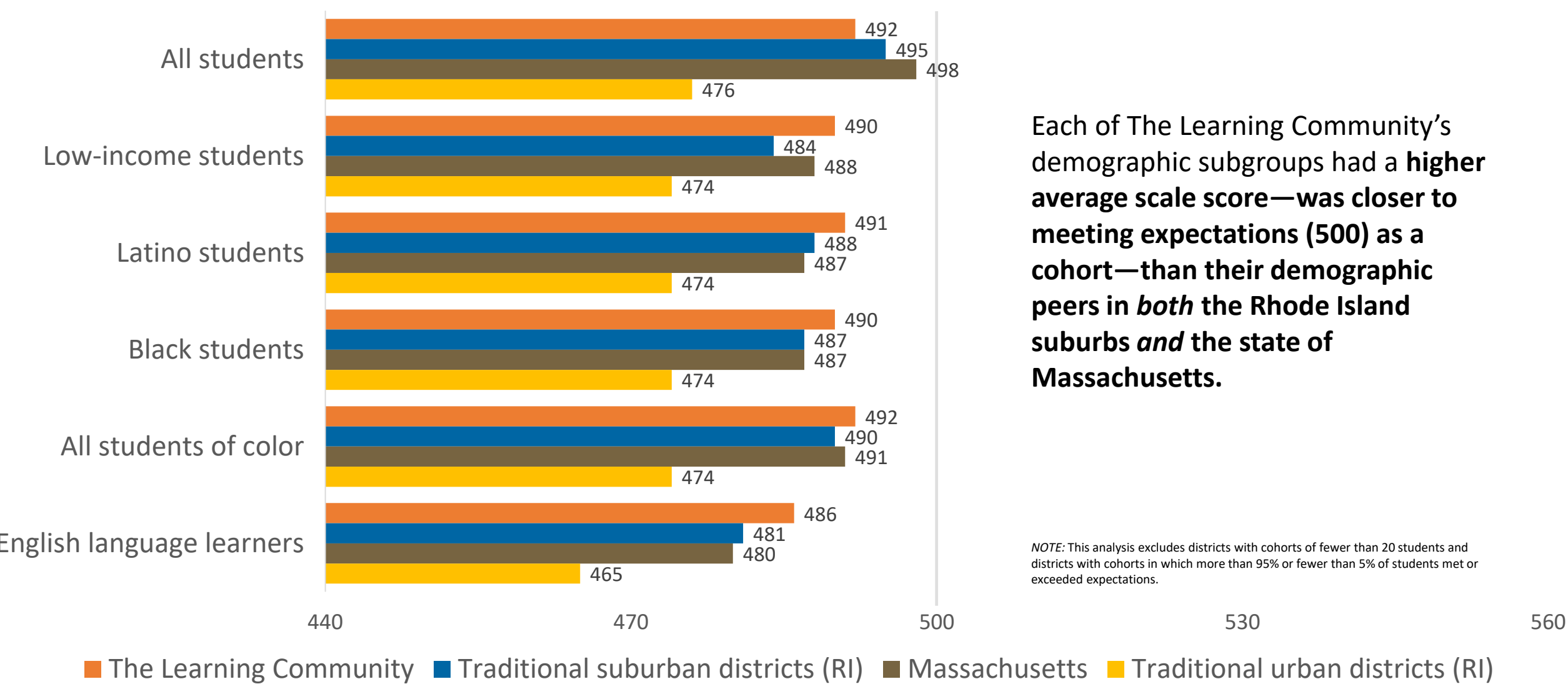

Low-income students	8 of 48 districts	83
Latino students	6 of 42 districts	86
Black students	9 of 35 districts	74
All students of color	11 of 44 districts	75
English language learners	3 of 24 districts	88
